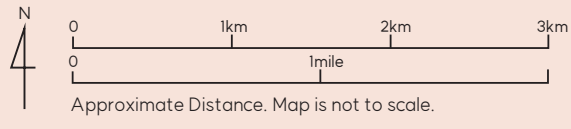
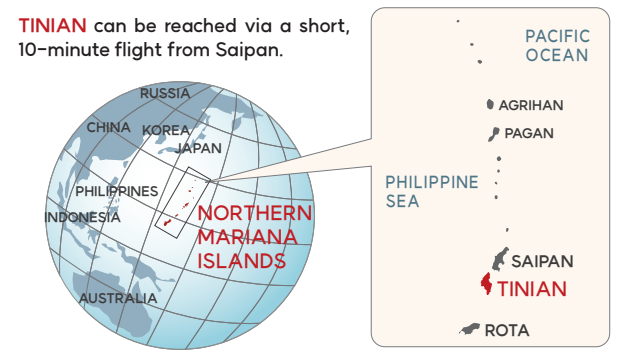


TINIAN



RUNWAY ABLE [D-1]
One of the four runways built by the Americans to accommodate the B29 Super fortress. In 1945, North Field Tinian was the busiest and biggest airfield in the world.

ATOMIC BOMB PITS [C-1]
In 1945, the atomic bombs nicknamed "Little Boy" and "Fat Man" were loaded onto the Enola Gay and Bockscar from here. They flew out of Tinian to carry out atomic missions against the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

HINODE SHRINE [D-2]
The ruins of a Shinto shrine built during the Japanese colonial era. The first and second torii gates are still standing. Also called NKK Shrine.

CHULU BEACH [C-1]
A secluded beach where you can relax and soak up the sun in peace. A good spot to search for star sand one of the rarest forms of sand formed from single-cell marine organisms called Foraminifera.



TACHOGNA BEACH [C-4]
A popular beach for family outings. The water depth here is relatively shallow making it a perfect spot for snorkeling and beginner-level beach diving.

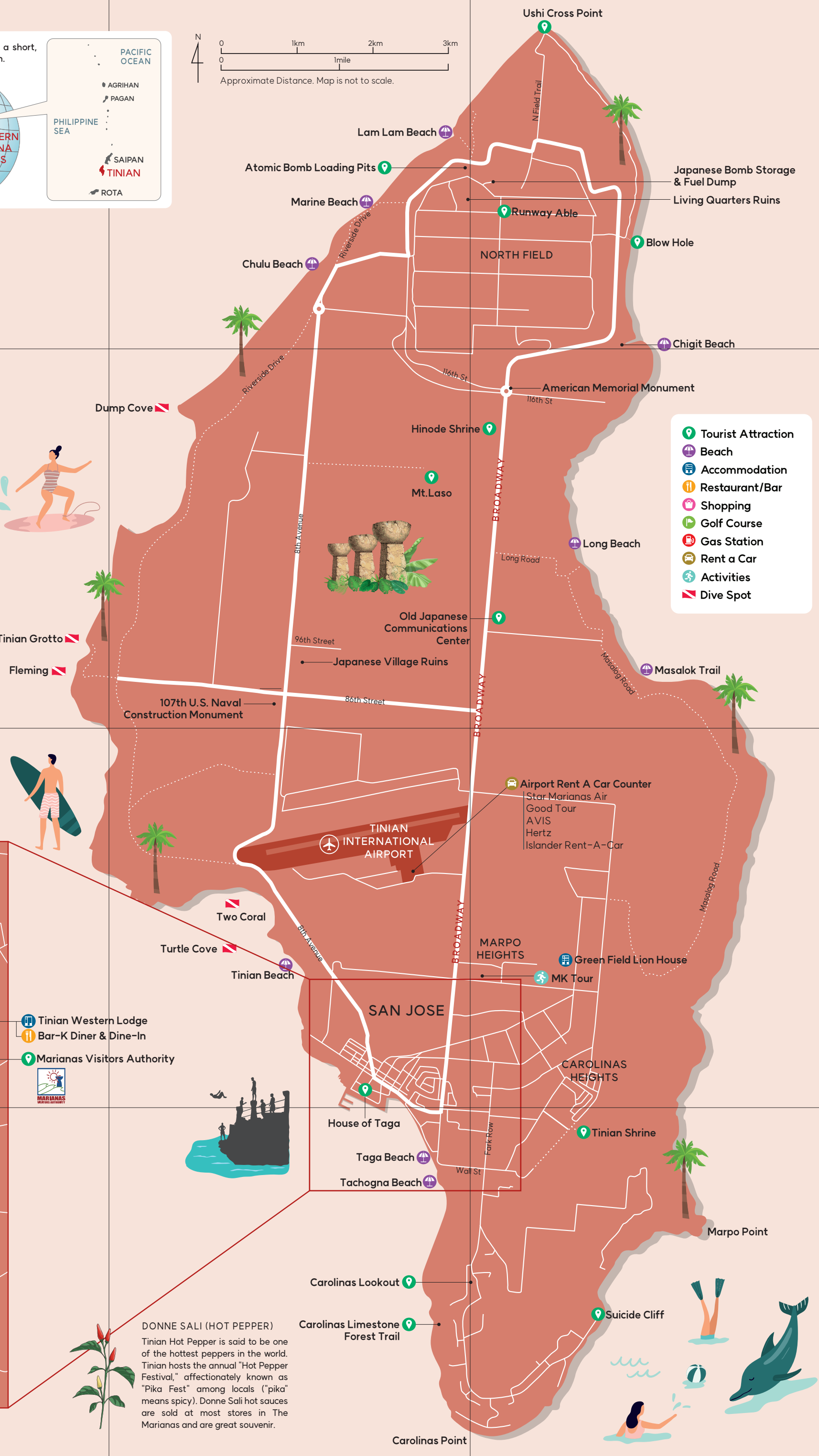
CAROLINAS LOOKOUT [D-4]
The lookout on top of the Carolinas Plateau has a great view of the Pacific Ocean, Tinian Harbor, and serene green landscape. There also is a trail entrance here.

FLEMING POINT [B-2]
An amazing boat dive that has a myriad of coral formations that resemble a forest filled with abundant marine animals and fish. The maximum depth is 70m.

TINIAN GROTTO [B-2]
A mysterious underwater cavern dive spot that boasts outstanding visibility. Look out for beautiful shrimps and crabs that live in the coral formations of the Grotto.



SAN JOSE



DONNE SALI (HOT PEPPER)
Tinian Hot Pepper is said to be one of the hottest peppers in the world. Tinian hosts the annual "Hot Pepper Festival," affectionately known as "Pika Fast" among locals ("pika" means spicy). Donne Sali hot sauces are sold at most stores in The Marianas and are great souvenir.

1 TAGA BEACH [C-4]
Taga Beach is a little bay surrounded by cliffs on both sides and is one of the must-visit places in Tinian. Locals and visitors alike love jumping off the rocks to splash into the pristine, emerald waters. It is also a perfect spot to watch the sunset.

2 BLOW HOLE [D-1]
Tinian Blow Hole is located on the northeast side of the island. The marine geyser sits amidst several natural pools and limestone terraces. The spray of water can shoot up to 200 feet in the air on windy days!

3 BROADWAY [D-2, D-3]
Broadway is the main north-south road of Tinian that stretches in a straight line. Open the windows (or the top if you're in a convertible) and drive down the road. It is lush green on both sides. The Ocean breeze is in your hair. That's it. Leave all your worries behind.

4 HOUSE OF TAGA [C-3]
A large twelve-stone latte house. As Taga is part of an extensive Latte Period village site built roughly around 1000 A.D. The latte shafts of the House of Taga measure four meters in height, making it the largest latte house ever erected in The Marianas.

5 OLD SAN JOSE CHURCH BELL TOWER [C-3]
The rest of the original church built by the Germans during the WWI was destroyed during the WWII and only the Bell Tower still stands. A new church was built near the tower in the 1950s.

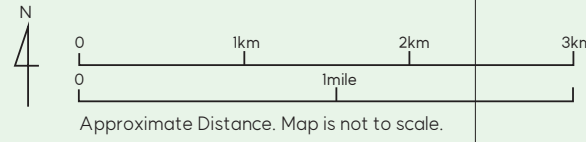
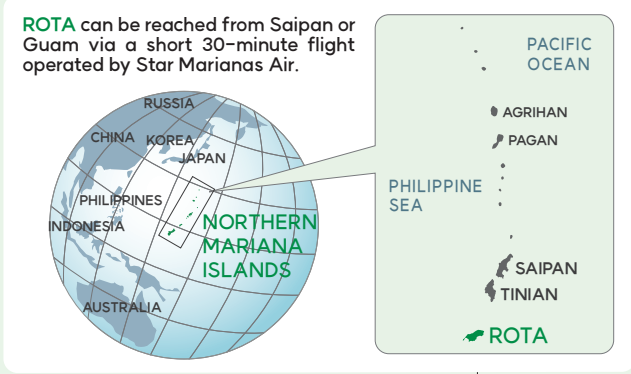

JAPANESE SUGAR MILL [A-2]
A former NKK sugar mill factory site established by the "Sugar King", Haruji Matsue. In front of the factory sits a red steam locomotive train which was used to transport sugar canes in 1930s.



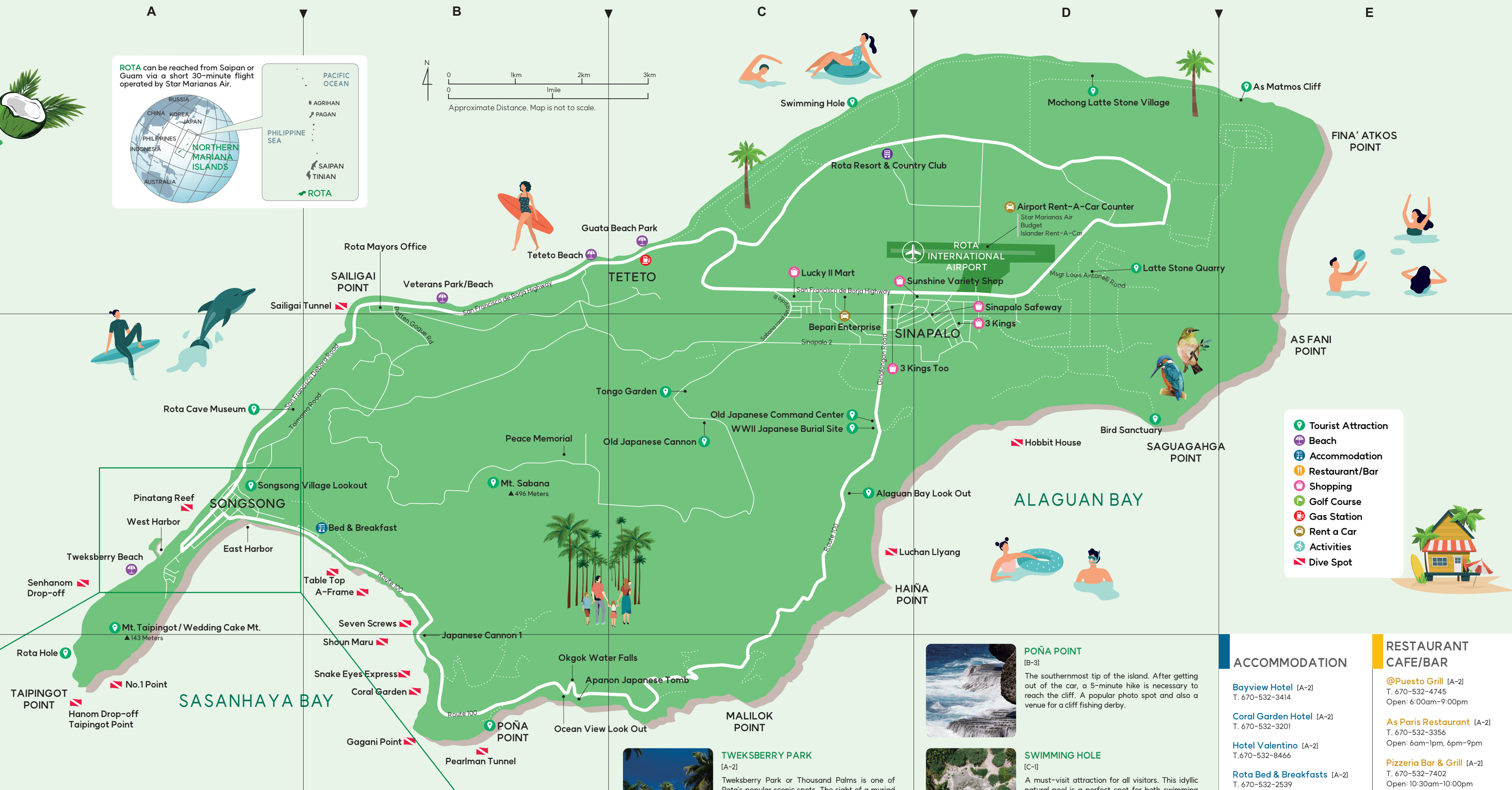
EAST HARBOR [A-2]
Visitors to Rota are often amazed by the exceptional clarity and vivid blue color (called "Rota Blue") of the ocean around the island. It is due to the low number of plankton in Rota's seawater.



HANOM DROP-OFF/ TAIPINGOT POINT [A-3]
This drop-off dive site at the tip of the cape goes down about 70m deep. The current can be strong so it's suitable for intermediate and advanced divers. Napoleon fish and black-tip sharks are spotted here frequently.



CORAL GARDEN [B-3]
Coral Garden is home to over 200 types of corals and more than 50 species of colorful tropical fish. Divers often encounter octopuses, nudibranchs, sharks and turtles during this boat dive.

SONGSONG VILLAGE



TWEKSBERY PARK [C-2]
Tweksberry Park or Thousand Palms is one of Rota's popular scenic spots. The sight of a myriad of coconut trees lined up in an orderly fashion makes you realize you are indeed visiting a tropical island. It's located near Songsong village and you can hike there if you'd like.

ROTA HOLE [D-3]
Rota Hole - along with the Grotto in Saipan - is one of the world's preeminent underwater cavern diving spots. The best season to visit is from April to September. The highlight of the dive is the bright, strong spotlight that enters the cavern directly from above. (For advanced divers only)

SONGSONG VILLAGE LOOKOUT [A-2]
Songsong Village Lookout offers visitors an expansive, scenic view of Songsong and the island's iconic Wedding Cake Mountain, with the Pacific Ocean to the east and the Philippine Sea to the west.

BIRD SANCTUARY [D-2]
Over 40 different kinds of birds - boobies, white terns, great frigatebirds, and more - live in this large, prehistoric wild bird habitat. The observation deck and trail built along the cliff top give you a panoramic view of the lush, untouched jungle and blue ocean. Don't forget to bring your binoculars!

TETETO BEACH [B-1]
Teteto Beach in Rota boasts fine, white sand and crystal-clear water. It was voted No.1 Readers' Choice Best Beach Overseas for three years in a row at the Dive and Travel Awards of the annual Marine Diving Fair in Japan.

POÑA POINT [B-3]
The southernmost tip of the island. After getting out of the car, a 5-minute hike is necessary to reach the cliff. A popular photo spot and also a venue for a cliff fishing derby.

SWIMMING HOLE [C-1]
A must-visit attraction for all visitors. This idyllic natural pool is a perfect spot for both swimming and taking photos. However, beware of the big waves crashing in when the sea is rough.

LATTE STONE QUARRY [D-1]
An important historical site where you can see how the latte stones were extracted from the rocks by the ancient Chamorro people. The latte stones here are believed to date back to at least 845 AD and are the largest found anywhere in The Marianas.

TONGA CAVE [A-2]
A massive cave that used to serve as a field hospital during WWII under the Japanese administration. It is located directly under the Songsong Village Lookout. Observe the natural rock formations and feel the cool air of the cave!

MT. TAIPINGOT/ WEDDING CAKE MT. [A-2]
Mt. Taipingot is called the "Wedding Cake Mountain" because it looks like a huge tiered cake if seen from a certain angle. The mountain area is a wild life conservation area established to protect the native flora and fauna that thrive there.

AS MATMOS CLIFF [E-1]
As Matmos is also the venue for the annual Cliff Fishing Derby. Large surf that normally breaks against the shore is very dangerous. Watching the giant waves of the Pacific Ocean smash against the stiff, rocky cliffs makes you marvel at the power of nature.
